Grief, loss and end-of-life: Our work – my life

The work we do affects who we are and who we are affects our work. Therefore, it is vital for healthcare providers to understand this relationship. The quality of care our patients receive depends on more than what we do for them individually – how we function together as ‘team’ is also critical. By understanding the dynamics of both our individual and team contributions to patient care, we can improve the quality of our care and become more fulfilled care providers.

Through presentation, discussion and self-reflection, participants in this full-day workshop will:

- 1 reflect upon and appreciate what you bring to the bedside;
- 2 better understand group process and be able to identify the ingredients that are essential for optimal teamwork;
- 3 understand the impact of relationships in your work;
- 4 deepen your sense and understanding of self.



Dr David Kuhl is the Founder and Director of the Centre for Practitioner Renewal and a Professor in the Department of Family Practice, Faculty of Medicine at the University of British Columbia. In 1996, he

became a Soros Faculty Scholar, Project on Death in America. This award allowed him to conduct a qualitative study that served as the basis for his doctoral dissertation and 2 books, entitled *What Dying People Want: Practical Wisdom for the End-of-Life* and *Facing Death Embracing Life, Understanding What Dying People Want*. The research also served as the basis for David’s work to understand the essence of iatrogenic suffering, thereby founding and developing the Centre for Practitioner Renewal.

Through his work at the Centre for Practitioner Renewal, David is working to combine his interests in medicine and psychology to develop a program of service, education and research that sustains health care providers in the work place, seeks to understand the effect of being in the presence of suffering and strives to work with health care providers in addressing features of resilience, communication and healthy relationships in the workplace.
