The Division of Community Health and Humanities, Memorial University invites applications for a tenure-track appointment in

Health Ethics

The appointment will be at the Assistant Professor level although initial rank and salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. The appointment is for a tenure-track position subject to budgetary approval.

The successful candidate's responsibilities will include teaching and related activities in the ethics undergraduate, graduate, and post-graduate programs in the Faculty of Medicine; establishing an independent, externally-funded program of research; and participation in service activities.

The successful candidate will join a team of ethicists, to participate in clinical ethics activities through a contractual arrangement with the Eastern Regional Health Authority and the newly established Provincial Health Ethics Network of Newfoundland and Labrador (PHENNL). These clinical ethics activities include ethics education, policy development, and ethics consultation on clinical and administrative cases in Newfoundland and Labrador's four regional health authorities as part of PHENNL.

Candidates should hold a PhD in a relevant field. Post-graduate training and clinical ethics experience in a medical or hospital setting would be an asset. The candidate's area of research should fall within the mandate of the Division.

The application package should include *curriculum vitae*, contact details of three referees, a letter of application giving an overview and discussion of qualifications and interests as they relate to the position along with statements of teaching philosophy and research interests, and one sample of scholarly writing.
